Desert Shores Budget for Fiscal Year 2023-2024

At their March 22, 2023 Board of Directors meeting, the board voted to approve the draft budget for the upcoming fiscal year, that runs June 1, 2023 to May 31, 2024, to be sent out to the membership. Owners will be receiving the budget mailing between April 7-10, 2023. The board and management worked diligently to present to you a reasonable budget by reviewing each line item, current information, projected year end numbers, reviewing contracts, and gathering information to help project where the costs will be for the upcoming fiscal year.

While an assessment increase isn't what anyone wants to hear, the Board has a fiduciary duty to protect, maintain, and enhance the assets of the community. Please know that every effort was made to present a reasonable budget, as inflation and overall costs of labor and materials are on the rise and there was very little to cut.

Three line items (Legal, Insurance, and Landscaping) represent 55% or \$286,336 of the budget increase. The other 46 line items make up the remaining 45% or \$238,724 of the budget increase. The board has approved a request for proposal (RFP) to be sent out for the landscape maintenance contract. Legal and insurance increases are a result of the lawsuits filed against the association. The association has received notices of nonrenewal for both the Umbrella Policy and the General Liability Policy. It is important to note that there are currently no judgements against the association, the potential is there, and insurance companies don't like potential. The insurance broker for the association is searching for other options and while hopeful they will find the required insurance the board has been informed to expect an increase. The current insurance policies expire May 31, 2023.

Landscape Maintenance Contract

Landscape Maintenance Contract sealed bids were opened at the March 22, 2023 board meeting. The results in alphabetical order are:

The board will meet in workshop on Wednesday, April 5th from 9:00am to 12:00pm to interview each of the landscape companies (in half hour increments). Owners are welcome to attend for observation only.

Update on the Mandatory Turf Conversion to comply with AB356

The main portions of Phase 1 – Regatta Drive between Buffalo and Mariner are complete. The last portion is at the sign monuments at the main entrance at Buffalo. After 34 years, the sign monuments and overall look will be updated. The board did not want to install the new landscape in these areas and then tear it up with the sign monument upgrade. Please be patient for a little bit longer.

The association has requested the rebate for the main portion of Phase 1 and are waiting for the final review and approval from the Southern Nevada Water Authority. Once that is received, the landscape conversion on Lake Sarah sides and south end can begin. The plan is for this phase to begin the first week of May.

To date, 2,661 owners have either paid in full or signed up for the 24 month payment plan. If you are one of the remaining 690 owners, please contact the DSCA office immediately. The special reserve assessment (SRA) is an assessment and therefore follows the Delinquency Policy and can be turned over to collections if not resolved in a timely manner. No one wants that!

New Excess Water Use Charge Now in Effect

With federal water shortages on the Colorado River continuing to impact how much water Southern Nevada can withdraw from Lake Mead, the Las Vegas Valley Water District (LVVWD) has enacted an excess use charge aimed at reducing unnecessarily high-water use for residential customers.

The excessive use charge went into effect Jan. 1, and is applied when water use exceeds established monthly thresholds that change seasonally (see chart below). The excessive use charge is \$9 per 1,000 gallons of water use above the seasonal thresholds. More information, including a water bill estimator, visit **Ivvwd.com**.

Winter (Nov. 1-Feb. 28)	14,000 gallons			
Spring (March 1-April 30)	16,000 gallons			
Summer (May 1-Aug. 31)	28,000 gallons			
Fall (Sept. 1-Oct. 31)	26,000 gallons			

Follow these simple tips to help manage your water bill:

Follow the mandatory seasonal watering restrictions and save up to \$300 annually on your water bill. Summer restrictions are in effect May 1 through Aug. 31 and prohibit spray irrigation between 11 a.m. and 7 p.m., when water can be lost to heat and high winds. Sunday watering is prohibited all year.

Upgrade your water-thirsty grass to a beautiful, vibrant water smart landscape and get \$3 per square foot from Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA). This can reduce your outdoor water use by up to 75 percent. Visit **snwa.com** to learn more.

Fix leaks and broken sprinklers or drip systems.

While you may be tempted to increase your landscape watering as temperatures start getting hotter, grass can survive with less water during this time of year. In May, while nights are still cool, gradually increase your sprinklers from three days to four. From there, keep an eye on your landscape and increase watering only as needed into June, July and August. On the other hand, plants and trees on drip irrigation can thrive with much less water. In the summer, water them two to three days a week. It's all they need.

Continuing to follow the seasonal watering schedules and restrictions will help you avoid excessive usage charges while saving money on your monthly bills. For more information about seasonal watering schedules and landscape tips, visit **snwa.com**

Financial Focus - Earth Day Lessons for Investors





Crime Triangle

Three things are needed for a crime to take place: **Desire**, **Ability**, and **Opportunity** to commit the crime. What side of the

equation can we control?

Opportunity! Here are some tips to help remove opportunity from the equation!



MAIL THEFT & PORCH PIRATES

- Report all mail theft, open/damaged mail boxes to the local USPS office.
- Schedule deliveries when you will be home.
- Take advantage of secure locker locations for deliveries.
- Have packages delivered to your work address instead of your home.
- Get your mail from your box, everyday and as soon as possible. Criminals are familiar with delivery schedules.
- Going out of town for an extended period? Request USPS to hold mail at post office until your return.
- Important outgoing mail? Opt to drop off at the Post Office directly vs. the outgoing mail slot.

GUN SAFETY & PREPAREDNESS

• <u>NEVER leave firearms in the car!</u>

- Remember... any weapon you use can also be used against you.
- Be Proficient! Make sure you are trained and knowledgeable about the weapon you own and carry.
- Take **your** firearm, regularly, for shooting practice and keep it well maintained.
- Record the serial number of your gun. In the event of theft, reporting your serial number will aid in the recovery of your stolen weapon.

ALARMS & SECURITY TIPS

- Make sure to use alarms and sensors on ALL entry points of your home: windows, sliding glass doors, etc.
- Invest in Security Laminate for glass doors and windows. Helps prevent glass from shattering in attempted break-ins.

BURGLARY PREVENTION TIPS

- Don't leave anything valuable or the appearance of valuables (charger cords/ cases) in your car and in view.
- LOCK your Doors! Car doors, front, back doors.... Everything!
- Close your Garage DOOR!
- Build relationships with your Neighbors.
- Get a dog No matter the size, a home with a barking dog is not a criminal's ideal
 target!
- Make your home look occupied Lights on or motion sensor activated, trim

shrubs/foliage, add shades/window coverings.

- Record serial numbers of all valuable items. Make sure to inventory your items, including pictures.
- Don't allow piggy backing at gated entries. You may feel awkward but you lessen the efficacy of gate by allowing entry.
- Protect Gate Codes at all times! Alert your Sub-Association, immediately, if you see codes posted at gate or know that a code has been compromised.
