



The Las Vegas Valley Water District (LVVWD) has released its annual Water Quality Report, which reveals that water delivered by the LVVWD continues to meet or surpass all state and federal safe drinking water standards.

The Water Quality Report, available online at lvvwd.com, contains important information about drinking-water sources, treatment, testing, and a detailed analysis of regulated and unregulated contaminants based on 2020 water-quality test results. The report also includes information about our community's water supply and how frequently it is sampled and analyzed.

In 2020, water quality scientists conducted 307,655 analyses on more than 54,465 water samples taken from Lake Mead—the source of 90 percent of the community's drinking water supply—from storage reservoirs and 367 sampling stations throughout the water distribution system. In addition, our community's drinking water is continually monitored 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Water drawn from the Las Vegas Valley groundwater aquifer is naturally filtered, so it is simply treated with chlorine as it enters the distribution system. Water drawn from Lake Mead is treated at the Southern Nevada Water Authority's (SNWA) two advanced water treatment facilities with a leading-edge combination of ozonation, filtration and chlorination.

In 2020, Southern Nevada's water quality scientists monitored for 91 regulated contaminants as required by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, as well as 75 unregulated contaminants to help protect the Las Vegas Valley's drinking water. Most of the test results are reported in parts per billion (ppb) – a very small unit of measurement. One part per billion is similar to:

- One pinch of salt in 10 tons of potato chips
- One second in more than 30 years
- One inch in 16,000 miles

The Federal Safe Drinking Water Act sets water-quality standards for all water purveyors, in Nevada, these standards are enforced by the State of Nevada's Bureau of Safe Drinking Water. Southern Nevada's drinking water is carefully treated and regularly tested to ensure it meets these stringent requirements.
