

Why is Desert Shores replacing turf?

The 2021 Nevada Legislature adopted AB 356 which requires the removal of nonfunctional turf by December 31, 2026. The Association's compliance is not discretionary. If the Association fails to comply, then, among other things, fines may be imposed. The Southern Nevada Water Authority website is a good resource for information on AB 356 and the implementation plan. snwa.com

Why do we need a special reserve assessment (SRA)?

ings account.

Desert Shores financials are healthy. However, our operating account is what funds the daily operations of the HOA including Utilities, Lake Maintenance, Landscape Maintenance, Courtesy Patrol, Insurance, Park and Lagoon Maintenance, Lifeguards, Payroll, and all other line items within our annual budget.

Our reserve account is funded to prepare for the replacement of existing elements that are costly and don't occur on a regular basis, like the renovation of the pool in 2015 or a new vehicle purchased this year. Much like your personal checking account vs a sav-

The cost to effectively complete this mandated project is admittedly very high. The Board considered borrowing money to fund the turf conversion, but the analysis confirmed that it was much more expensive to the Association and the individual owners.

Accordingly, to complete the project and not have a negative effect on the routine operations and maintenance of the community, the Board determined that levying an SRA was the Association's best option. This will allow the Association to maintain the statutorily mandated adequate funding in the reserve account, while simultaneously attempting to protect, maintain, and enhance the community common areas and the values of the individual units. The SRA will allow this project to be completed and comply with the law. The project was not something the Association could foresee and the Board shares your frustration and concern. The SRA will be levied effective October 1, 2022. Details and payment plan information will be mailed to each owner mid-August.

Why do we need to fund the project all at once, can't we do it one phase at a time? In order to comply with the mandate and finish on time the Board must be constantly moving forward with a timeline and plans. It will be a continuous effort. Once one phase is approved and work scheduled the next phase will be put into motion, so it is ready to go and to keep the ball rolling. Designs, approvals, contracts all take time. To commit the Association to projects that we do not have the funds for is a risk. To have to go out to the homeowners for funds for each phase would not be effective. It is unlikely that the HOA will receive ALL the funds initially. It could take two years to collect the SRA in total. If you can pay the full amount, it would be much appreciated and helpful to the Association.

What happens to the rebates from the Water District?

The SRA for Nonfunctional Turf Removal will have a designated account. All funds received for the SRA will go into this account; including owners' payments and any rebates received from the Water District.

This account will track all expenditures from the project and provide a clean accounting of the SRA. All rebate funds will go into the SRA account and will be used toward the completion of the project.

We must apply for rebates one project at a time and the project must be fully completed and verified by the water district to receive the rebate before we can apply for another rebate. To receive the maximum possible rebates the phases are planned accordingly based on size, amount of turf being removed and amount of rebate available.

The board meeting will be conducted in person and virtually, via Zoom. We will communicate registration instructions, to homeowners, prior to the date of the meeting via email and our website.

Agendas are available 24 hours prior to the meeting and are posted on the website or in the management office. Unit owners have the right to:

- Have copies of the audio recording, the Minutes or a summary of the Minutes of the meeting distributed upon request and upon payment to the Association for the cost of making the distribution.
- Speak to the Board of Directors at the beginning of the meeting (on agenda items only) and the end of each meeting (on any item concerning the community).

What happens if we have surplus money in the account once the project is complete?

If there are surplus funds at the completion of the project the funds may be

- (1) Added to the existing reserve account to increase the funding percentage (which could reduce the amount of contribution needed from regular assessments),
- (2) Credited to the owners to reduce their future assessments for common expenses, or
- (3) Returned to the owners.

What Grass will Desert Shores be able to keep?

DSCA has received verbal approval from the Southern Nevada Water Authority that we can keep most of our lake ends. South Lake Sarah is fenced in and not accessible, so it is not favorable that it will remain grass. All other lake ends are accessible to the whole community however, we may lose portions of these areas. The current approval is verbal, the Association will be submitting for waivers to confirm this.

To count as functional turf, the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) Implementation Plan requires irrigated lawn grass area to be located no closer than 10 feet from a street, installed on slopes less than 25 percent, and not installed within street medians, along streetscapes. The areas must be at least 1,500 contiguous square feet or greater. A full copy of the Implementation Plan is available at snwa.com or mydesertshores.com.

What is the plan?

Representatives from SNWA have been on-site at Desert Shores and they have toured and measured the existing turf areas in the community.

There are areas of existing grass that do not meet the criteria listed above. For example, the first phase of the project, Regatta Drive between Buffalo and Mariner. This is streetscape, most of the turf is closer than 10 feet to the street and the other turf would not meet the 1,500 contiguous square feet requirement. DSCA has been approved for a rebate for the removal of 54,291 square feet of turf. After final approval of the completed project, the SNWA rebate should be \$96,436.50, which will be put towards the next phase

of the turf conversion project.

Another example of areas that do not meet the requirements of "functional" turf are what DSCA calls its "greenbelts": the turf area along the lake sides. These areas are fenced off to the community and access is only permitted from an owner's yard to their dock. DSCA has received verbal denial on keeping the greenbelts. Nevertheless, waivers for these areas have been submitted to SNWA and we are waiting for a written decision.

What Grass will Desert Shores NOT be able to keep?

The complete project has been divided into phases.

The first phase is Regatta Drive between Buffalo and Mariner. Phase one, proposed landscape design can be viewed below, in office, or on or website under the Mandatory Turf Conversion section of the homepage. This streetscape is the main entrance to our beautiful community. This project will take approximately 5 to 6 months to complete and work will begin September 6, 2022. Once complete, we can submit to SNWA to begin the next phase of the project.

The second phase: At their July 27, 2022, Board of Directors meeting, the Board voted to obtain a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the Lake Sarah greenbelt lake sides and south end turf area. The board will need to review and approve the RFP to be sent out for sealed bid. The estimated project start is planned for March to April 2023.

The following phases are: Lake Maddison lake sides, Lake Lindsey lake sides, Lake Jacqueline north lake sides, Regatta along south Lake Jacqueline, lake ends that will require some turf removal, Soaring Gulls streetscape, and miscellaneous areas such as the grass area outside of the clubhouse and offices, San Marino entrance to Villa Colonnade and Villa Finestra, corners of the breakwater bridge, Crosspointe entrance off Soaring Gulls, the grass area at Regatta and Breakwater.

Once plans are in place for the lake ends, the Association will be submitting waiver requests for the lake ends and other areas.



FINANCIAL FOCUS- What should you know about IRA Rollovers?

If you've been contributing to an IRA, you've chosen a great way to save and invest for retirement. All IRAs have potential tax benefits and a range of investment possibilities, but not all IRA providers offer the same features. to another IRA. No taxes will be withheld from the amount transferred at the time of the transfer. This method is generally hassle-free, but some IRA sponsors will still only mail the check to your address of record, so you'd have to forward it to your new IRA.

* Indirect rollover — If you take an indirect rollover, also known as a 60-day rollover, the assets from your existing IRA will be liquidated and the custodian or plan sponsor will send you a check or deposit the funds directly into your bank or brokerage account. This payment may be subject to withholding for federal taxes, and possibly state taxes, unless you opt out of withholding. You have 60 calendar days from the time the funds were withdrawn to deposit the money, including any amount withheld, into a new IRA. If you miss this 60-day deadline, the withdrawal may be taxable at your personal income tax rate, and it could also be subject to an early withdrawal penalty if you're younger than 59 ½.

Given the immediate withholding and the possibility of further taxes if you don't move the money into a new IRA before the 60 days are up, you've got much to consider before initiating an indirect rollover. Consequently, you should consult with a financial advisor and tax professional before you make

In addition to a rollover from an existing IRA, you may someday want to move the money from your 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan to an IRA. This can occur when you retire or change jobs, although if you do take on another job, you might have the options of leaving your 401(k) with your former employer or rolling it over into your new employer's plan. However, if you do want to move your 401(k) funds into an IRA, you can make what's known as a direct rollover, in which the administrator of your old retirement plan will send you a check made payable to the custodian of your IRA. No taxes will be withheld, but you need to get the funds transferred within 60 days to avoid any potential tax issues.

Infrastructure investments help secure Southern Nevada's water future

Continued investments in critical infrastructure enable the Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) to assure a safe, reliable supply of water for the community despite a climate change-fueled megadrought impacting the Colorado River—the source of 90 percent of our community's water supply.

Among the most recent investments are a new Low Lake Level Pumping Station (L3PS) and a deep-water intake, which allow the SNWA to draw water from the lowest depths of Lake Mead. These projects not only protect Southern Nevada's access to its primary water supply, but also help safeguard us all from water-quality issues associated with declining lake levels. Combined, Intake No. 3 and the L3PS allow Southern

Nevada to access water supplies below Lake Mead's "dead pool" elevation of 895 feet—the point at which no water can pass through Hoover Dam to generate power or meet downstream water demands in California, Arizona, or Mexico.

Completed in 2020 and put into full operation earlier this year, the L3PS can deliver up to 900 million gallons a day to the SNWA's two

water treatment facilities. This allows the agency to continue sustainable management of Southern Nevada's water resources in conjunction with the community's ongoing and highly successful conservation efforts.

Construction of Intake No. 3 began in 2008 and was completed in late 2015. A 24-foot diameter tunnel boring machine was utilized to excavate a tunnel under Lake Mead before connecting with an intake structure secured to the bottom of the lake with more than 1.000 truck-loads of concrete.

L3PS and Intake No. 3 are key elements of a network of water intakes, treatment facilities, pumping stations, reservoirs and pipelines operating 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Combined, these facilities can store up to 1 billion gallons of water and pump more than 1 million gallons per minute through thousands of miles of pipes.

With SNWA's long-range water resource planning, the community's ongoing water conservation achievements, and critical infrastructure such as Intake No. 3 and L3PS, Southern Nevada remains one of the most water-secure communities in the Southwest.

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

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



- ✓ Children should never walk or bicycle alone.
- ✓ Teach your child his/her full name, address, and your full name and phone number.
- Let your child know that police officers are there to help them, and how to identify police.
- Teach your child to report violence, threats, or any suspicious activity.
- Talk with your child about safety and violence prevention. Discuss incidents and how they might have been avoided.
- ✓ Teach your child body autonomy and boundaries.
- Talk with your child regarding proper and respectful phone etiquette while at school.
- Stay vigilant of your child's electronic devices by monitoring their activity.
- Instruct your child to report social media posts that may be a school or student threat to a responsible adult or law enforcement agency. Do not repost it
- Check your child's backpack to see what they may be leaving with or bringing home.


Basic Safety Tips Tips for Children Who Walk or Bike to School


- √ Parents/Guardians should know with whom their child is walking or bicycling and what is his/ her normal route to school.
- ✓ Remind your child not to take shortcuts through or play alone in deserted areas.
- ✓ Parents/Guardians should walk or ride with their younger children and occasionally accompany older children to school, or monitor the route.
- Watch out for vehicles at every driveway and intersection. Look for drivers in parked cars as they may be getting ready to move.
- Remember to cross streets only at crosswalks and/or intersections, and to always stop, look both ways (left, right, then left), and continue to look as you cross the street.
- Bicycles should be ridden only on the right side of the street, preferably in a bike lane, or on a multiuse pathway.
- ✓ Bicyclists should always wear a helmet, and walk their bike across busy streets and through crosswalks.

- When a sidewalk is not available, walk on the shoulder of the road facing the oncoming traffic.
- Respect crossing guards.
- ✓ Remind your child not to be on their cell phones while walking or bicycling.

Being Smart Around Strangers

- ✓ Talk with your child(ren) about what a stranger is and provide them with examples.
- Instruct your child never to accept candy, money, gifts, or any other items from strangers.
- Instruct your child to never get into a car with a stranger.
- ✓ Instruct your child to never go with a stranger into an enclosed or partially enclosed location, such as a garage or alley.
- Never hitchhike.
- ✓ Stress the importance of protesting and running away if a stranger tries to take your child away or entice your child into his/ her car.
- Advise your child on safe places to go in the event of danger.
