## Quack Quack Corner

### "The 411 on What's Happening"

- The greenbelt behind lake front homes is for ingress/ egress to the dock only.
- ♦ Your dock must be kept clean at all times.
- Do not run extension cords across the greenbelt to power your boats. If you need to run power to the dock you must contact the office for advice on how to properly take care of this.
- Landscaping in rear yards is treated the same as front yards since it can be seen from the common area.
- Accent lighting in your backyard must not exceed the design guidelines and must not be intrusive to your neighbors beside or across the lake. The brightness of your lighting must not exceed the equivalent of 450 lumens.
- Do not store your boats, canoe or kayak on the greenbelt. They must be stored in your backyard or elsewhere.

## The Real (Estate) Facts

#### **LOCAL HOUSING UPDATE**

A recent report released by the Las Vegas Realtors, (formerly Greater Las Vegas Association of REALTORS®), shows local home prices setting another record despite the coronavirus pandemic.

The median sales price of previously owned single-family homes - the bulk of the market - was \$337,250 in September, up 0.7 percent from the previous record, set in August, and 8.8 percent from a year ago, according to the trade association The trend is similar for condominiums and town homes.

Sales volume accelerated even faster, with buyers purchasing 3,270 homes last month, up 12.4 percent from August and 18.9 percent year over year. The tally of available listings was down 34.6 percent from September 2019, LVR reported.

"Local home prices keep setting records, which is really remarkable when you think about all the challenges we're facing," LVR President Tom Blanchard, said in a news conference. Las Vegas' housing market has heated up in recent months despite the fallout from the coronavirus pandemic, which has devastated the tourism industry, Southern Nevada's main financial engine, and sparked huge job losses. By all accounts, record-low mortgage rates have provided much of the fuel by letting homebuyers lock in lower monthly payments.

These statistics include activity through the end of September 2020 based on data collected through the MLS system which does not always include newly constructed homes by the local builders or homes for sale by owners.

#### Pumpkin Cheesecake

For the Crust

1 1/4 cups graham-cracker crumbs (from 10 whole crackers) 1/4 cup sugar

4 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted

#### **Directions**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees, with rack in center.
- 2. Assemble a 9-inch nonstick spring form pan, with the raised side of the bottom part facing up.
- 3. Make the crust: In a medium bowl, mix cracker crumbs, sugar, and butter until moistened; press firmly into bottom of pan. Bake until golden around edges, 10 to 12 minutes.
- 4. Make the filling: With an electric mixer, beat cream cheese and sugar on low speed until smooth; mix in flour (do not overmix). Add pumpkin puree, pie spice, vanilla, and salt; mix just until smooth. Add eggs one at a time, mixing until each is incorporated before adding the next.
- 5. Place spring form pan on a rimmed baking sheet. Pour filling into spring form, and gently smooth top. Transfer to oven; reduce oven heat to 300 degrees. Bake 45 minutes without opening the oven. Turn off oven; to prevent the top from cracking, let cheesecake stay in oven 2 hours more (without opening).
- 6. Remove from oven; cool completely. Cover with plastic wrap; refrigerate until firm, at least 4 hours. Unmold before serving.

Prep: 30 mins Total: 8 hrs Servings: 12



For the Filling

4 packages (8 ounces each) bar cream cheese, very soft

1 1/4 cups sugar

3 tablespoons all-purpose flour 1 cup canned pumpkin puree

2 tablespoons pumpkin-pie spice

1 tablespoon vanilla extract 1/2 teaspoon salt

4 large eggs, room temperature

## Pedestrian Safety: The 10 Walking Safety Tips

- 1. Be predictable. Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals.
- 2. Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available.
- 3. If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible.
- 4. Keep alert at all times; don't be distracted by electronic devices that take your eyes (and ears) off the road.
- 5. Whenever possible, cross streets at crosswalks or intersections, where drivers expect pedestrians. Look for cars in all directions, including those turning left or right.

6. If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate a well

lit area where you have the best view of traffic. Wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely; continue watching for traffic as you cross.

7. Never assume a driver sees you. Make eye contact with drivers as they approach to make sure you are seen.



- 8. Be visible at all times. Wear bright clothing during the day, and wear reflective materials or use a flashlight at night.
- 9. Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways, or backing up in parking lots.

## Thanksgiving Fun!

#### **Turkey Mask Arts and Crafts**

#### **Supplies Needed**

Brown, Red and Yellow construction paper (or white and the kids can color their own). Wooden dowel, chopstick or straw (or thin elastic band) bit of packing or scotch tape.

#### **Directions**

- 1. Visit the Desert Shores website for the link to the pattern. You will find it on the main page <a href="www.desertshores.org">www.desertshores.org</a>
  Print the pattern onto a piece of paper or cardstock. Cut out the pattern pieces (mask, gobbler, and beak) and trace onto your construction paper. You can also print the image directly onto colored construction paper
- 2. Cut out the pattern pieces and glue the beak to the bottom center of the mask. Then glue the red gobbler part slightly overlapping the beak and brown paper. Laminate the masks at this point so you can use them in years to come (optional).




3. Attach a dowel, craft stick, chopstick or straw to the back of the mask. We've used clear packing tape to tape a thick craft straw towards the back right side of our turkeys. That way it can be used as a handle. You could also punch two little holes into the sides of the mask and run some elastic through, so it can be worn without having to hold it up to the face.
