

Message from the General Manager ~ Cary Brackett

"Rest is not idleness, and to lie sometimes on the grass on a summer day listening to the murmur of water, or watching the clouds across the sky, is hardly a waste of time."

The temp is on the rise and don't forget the Lagoon Pool is only a short distance away and ever so refreshing on a hot summer day. Maybe a 4th of July BBQ in the Park is in your future or a boat ride around the lake, either way I hope everyone has a great summer full of memories. Of course these amenities are available only to DSCA Residents with a DSCA ID card and their guests, so if you don't have a DSCA ID card, please stop by the office to get one. Please read on to learn more about current and upcoming projects and please let me know if you have a club or event you would like to pitch.

Projects Update

- ◆ The Lagoon Restrooms have been completed and I hope you agree that the upgrades are spectacular and a real enhancement to everyone using the Lagoon or renting the clubhouse for that special event.
- For our long-term landscape renovation plan, the next project is to renovate the 4 corners at Regatta & Mariner, including the micro-park at the end of South Lake Jacqueline. Elements of this project include: 1) 60% turf reduction that will generate a sizable rebate from the LVVWD (to offset some of the cost of the project) and still provide that green grass look. 2) Install a low rock retaining wall on 3 corners which will provide a planter area but more importantly prevent the irrigation water from flowing onto the sidewalk and into the gutter. 3) Improve irrigation and grading. 4) Replace turf and existing plants to improve density, color and water efficiency. 5) Replace over grown pampas grasses with dwarf pampas grasses, which are easier to manage long-term. 6) Add a complete walking path through the micropark. 7) Replace over grown plants in micro-park to allow visibility of the lake through the micro-park. 8) Re-locate the etched rock sign to the street corner as a focal point. 9) New micro-park lighting with a concentration of up-lighting on the trees to compliment the new bollard lights around the lake. We are in the process of going out to bid for this project with plans of starting this project in the fall. Plans are available to view on the website.
- The project on North Lake Jacqueline, to replace and paint the wrought iron and repair and paint the stucco wall was approved by the board and work is in the process of being scheduled

If you have a home on North Lake Jacqueline, you will be receiving multiple letters with an exact start date and information on how to be prepared for the removal of the existing fence. We have a 6 year rotating schedule for all fencing and walls, so beginning in 2020 and continuing through 2021, we will be working on all exterior walls. The board is considering a possible change in the color scheme for the walls, so stayed tuned next year to see what options may be considered.

Governing Document Restate

Keep Desert Shores a Premier Las Vegas Community!

Over the past few months we have been spreading the word that the Desert Shores Governing Documents are in the process of being amended. We have held two Town Hall sessions and the turn out for these events was great. The Board of Directors, the Restate Committee and the Associations Attorney received valuable feedback on the proposed documents. Below are some answers to frequently asked guestions on the process.

Q: Why do the Governing Docs need to be changed?

A: Our documents are 30 years old and changes are being proposed to be compliant with State statutes, improve how the community is managed for the next 30 years, and will benefit everyone.

Q: How will this process work?

A: As you can imagine it's a difficult process at best and will require an affirmative vote from 67% of the all homeowners. The ballot will be made up of 3 parts: 1) administrative changes including: grammatical, punctuation and removal of obsolete language, 2) all updates necessary to be compliant with Federal, State and Local Statutes and 3) individual changes that will benefit the long term management of the community.

Q: What are some of the important changes being proposed?
A: Other than the administrative and statute changes, here are few important individual revisions being proposed: Community Relations Committee (review, approval and enforcement procedures), Pet Policy, Garage Occupancy, Noise & Odor Restrictions, Lake View Protection, Leasing/Rental Rules & Guidelines, Owner Voting Procedures, Capital Improvements Expenditure Limits and Reserve Contributions from New Owners.

Q: When can I review the proposed draft changes?A: The draft documents are now posted on the website to view, they are available to be emailed, or they are available at the office

if you require a hard copy.

The Board of Directors has approved the proposed amendments to the CC&R's and Bylaws along with the Ballot. Homeowners will be receiving the ballot package along with a summary letter in the mail early to mid July and there will be announcements on the website as this occurs.

Please check www.desertshores.org for up to date Restate Information.

- It will improve the Board and Management abilities to work effectively and in a timely manner by ensuring documents are up to date and the verbiage is accurate and grammatically correct.
- ♦ It will allow the Board to add new Improvements to the Community if the cost is less than 5% of the budgeted gross expenses. This will allow improvements to be made in the Community in a timely manner, keeping DSCA a competitive housing market. Contributing to the goal that Desert Shores remains a beautiful, detailed, clean place to live with amenities that meet the residents needs and likes.
- It will allow a Capital Contribution fee to future home sales, paid by the buyer at closing. This will increase the funding of the reserves account, without an increase in assessments. These funds are used for the Common Area elements to ensure the property is maintained and enhanced to remain a top community to live in and to protect property values.
- While most of the items on the ballot are considered housekeeping; outdated information, incorrect verbiage or grammar, the above items will have a significant impact on the HOA's ability to not only maintain the property but enhance it as well.

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The Real (Estate) Facts

THE 10 YEAR FIX... Once your home hits the 10-year mark, it's probably time for some home maintenance. Here are some updates your home will *benefit from the most*, according to recent surveys.

Get new carpeting. Replace your carpeting if tears, stains and odors remain, even after a good cleaning. Now might be the time to consider wood or "wood look" tile flooring as it is so popular right now.

Replace the hot water tank. A water heater may not show signs before it leaks or fails, but if it's been around for ten years or more, it should be replaced.

Update ceiling fans. If the fan's light bulbs seem to burn out more quickly than usual, its usually time for a new fan all together

Re-glaze windows. Re-glazing old windows is easier and more cost effective than replacing them.

LOCAL HOUSING MARKET UPDATE

The Greater Las Vegas Association of REALTORS® (GLVAR) recently reported that local home prices are hovering at \$300,000, while the number of homes on the market continues to increase. That's up only 1.7 percent from May 2018. "The rate of appreciation has really been slowing down, and that has become especially apparent over the last few months. In fact, this is the smallest year-over-year increase since May 2012" stated the President of the local Association, Janet Carpenter.

Meanwhile, the median price of local condominiums and townhomes sold in May was \$179,500. That was up 12.2 percent from this same time last year.

At the current sales pace, Southern Nevada still has less than a three-month supply of homes available for sale. The housing supply is up from one year ago but still below what would be considered a balanced market. At the end of May, GLVAR reported 7,855 single family homes listed for sale without any sort of offer to purchase. That's up a whopping 90.7 percent from one year ago.

For condominiums and townhomes, the listed for sale properties without offers in May represented a 134.8 percent jump from one year ago.

Summer Watering Schedule

Running your landscape irrigation system outside your assigned days is water waste and may result in a water waste fee or citation from the Las Vegas Valley Water District.

For lawns the LVVWD recommends use of the cycle and soak method for sprinkler watering your assigned watering days. Water in three 4-minute cycles with about an hour between each cycle. If you use pop-up sprinklers they recommend watering for about 12 minutes each watering cycle if using rotating sprinkler heads.

It is always good news when you or your neighbors are fixing up the exterior of their homes. When we take good care of our property, it helps the whole community! All exterior projects, whether in the front yard or backyard, require the submittal of an application for review.

Community Relations Meeting Information

The Community Relations Committee "CRC" meets the 1st Monday of each month to review ARC Applications submitted by a homeowner along with conducting CC&R violation hearings.

In order to have your application on the agenda you must submit all completed paperwork to the DSCA office along with the \$10 fee by the *Wednesday prior to the CRC meeting by noon.*

Note: that if you live in a gated community you <u>MUST</u> receive approval from your Sub Association first in order to submit your application to the CRC

Landscape Talk

It's getting even hotter now, the best time to do any gardening is in the early morning or later in the day (after 5 pm). The goal is to avoid the crippling heat and do your gardening chores when the temperatures are much more comfortable, and you'll be much happier!

Watering: Get up early this summer. We recommend watering early in the morning, between 4 am and 8 am. Early morning watering reduces the evaporation loss. We recommend deep watering as it is the best way to ensure that the entire root zone becomes saturated. When it comes to watering trees, be sure to saturate the soil at least three feet deep. When watering shrubs, drench the soil at least one foot deep. Deep water with a hose every ten to fourteen days. Water your containers twice a day. White crust buildup on containers is salt buildup; remove and water heavily to flush out salts. We recommend deep watering your flower beds and vegetable gardens two to three times a week.

Fertilizing: Use a slow-release fertilizer for containers. Roses should be fed during the middle of the month to encourage more flowering. Fertilizers are designed to help trees, palms, and shrubs recover from any heat stress.



Protect the Trunk of Your Tree: Trees can get sunburn. When the temperatures soar, protect young trees. A protective tree wrap is recommended. It is a good idea to stake both young and older trees. Staking trees will provide stability, especially during high wind days in Las Vegas.

Mulching: Keep the soil moist all summer long. A great way to keep the soil wet is to apply mulch around the base of the tree. We recommend adding a three to four-inch layer of mulch. Doing this can retain moisture and keep the soil cool during the summer months. Keep a thick layer of mulch around the roots of trees and shrubs, too.

Pruning: Encourage new growth by removing dead or faded flowers. Remove annual flowers that have finished flowering.

Vegetable Garden: Transplants of tomatoes, eggplants, and peppers should be planted. It is also an excellent time to start seeding lima beans, squash, and pumpkins.

Tip: If you have garlic and onions, they are ready when their tops start to bend over. After they have dried for a couple of weeks, remove their tops and store in a cool place.

Lawn Care: Raising the mowing height to 2.5 to 3-inches is recommended. Be sure to water your lawn with one inch of water per week.
